HEIGHTS HOTEL WILDLIFE BREAKS Friday January 19th – Sunday January 21st 2018



Saturday January 20th

Weather: mostly calm and overcast but with some sunshine in the afternoon

Ferrybridge 0900

We started our weekend's birding with a brief stop at Ferrybridge to have a close look at a small group of dark-bellied Brent geese, one of which was one of the very few first-year birds seen this year.

Arne RSPB Reserve 1030

It was a beautifully calm morning at this superb reserve and thankfully remained dry. Our walk out to Shipstall Point was very productive with good views of treecreeper, nuthatch, coal tit and, best of all, a beautiful firecrest. The firecrest wasn't in view for long but still managed to give the whole group very close views as it hopped along a wire fence. Reaching the shores of Poole Harbour we had good views of several mergansers but only very distant views of a small group of goldeneye that were feeding out beyond Round Island. The hide at Shipstall Point was full up but from the ground-level screens we enjoyed great telescope views of several beautiful drake pintail and no les than twenty spoonbills.

After lunch we walked out to Coombe Heath hoping to see Dartford warblers. None showed up but we were more than happy with the thousands of waders that were feeding out in Middlebere Lake. Most were avocets but there were also large numbers of curlews, black-tailed godwits, redshanks and lapwings with smaller numbers of grey plovers and dunlins. The walk back to the car park produced a flock of meadow pipits and a very handsome herd of twenty or so sika deer.

Portland Bill 1730

We finished the day with a tour of the road between the Bill and Southwell looking for short-eared and barn owls, but none were out tonight.

Saturday January 21st

Weather: foggy with light rain in the morning, drier in the afternoon, wind south-westerly

Portland Bill 0900

A very damp Portland Bill gave us good views of guillemots, razorbills and gannets along with more distant views of fulmars and kittiwakes. On the land we found rock pipits and turnstones with two purple sandpipers flying past just offshore.

Chiswell 1030

A quick but very productive stop to see a black redstart which has been here all winter.

Portland Castle 1100

Our first look at Portland Harbour gave us exceptionally close views of a great northern diver with redbreasted mergansers and black-necked grebes further out.

Hamm Beach 1100

Looking out over the central area of Portland Harbour we found several more black-necked grebes along with a distant female common scoter.

Sandsfoot 1130

Moving on a half mile to the north added just a few more great crested grebes to the day's list and brought the black-necked grebe total up to seven.

Ferry bridge 1200

The small flock of brent geese here turned out to be all of the dark-bellied race. Out on the shoreline were a hundred or so dunlins and a single bar-tailed godwit. Probably the best bird here was the immature kittiwake that flew past very close being pursued by a very aggressive herring gull.

Bincleaves 1300

Our final look at Portland Harbour was over the northern corner which today only showed us a few great crested grebes and red-breasted mergansers.

Lodmoor RSPB Reserve 1400

Quite a few duck were seen here including gadwall, pochard and tufted duck but not the scaup we hoped for. A very smart female-type male marsh harrier was a good second prize though.

Radipole RSPB Reserve, 1500

Mediterranean gulls were probably the most memorable birds here with a hundred or more seen as they passed through on their way to their roost in Weymouth Bay. Driving back through Weymouth we stopped to watch the impressive starling murmuration over the town centre, which all agreed was a very good way to end an excellent weekend.
